World Mission Sunday: World Mission Sunday is February 26th (Last Epiphany.) The last Sunday in Epiphany of each year is designated as World Mission Sunday – a time when the church comes together to focus on the global impact of our call to "seek and serve Christ in all persons" (Baptismal Covenant, Book of Common Prayer, p. 305). Gospel Notes: The Season of The Epiphany ends on Feb. 26 with the mysterious event of Jesus appearing "dazzling white" to Peter, James and John, Jesus' "inner circle" whom he leads up a mountain. It is a moment of Christ's divinity, as he appears between the two great Old Testament prophets, Moses and Elijah. Peter has confessed that Jesus is indeed the Messiah. Jesus had predicted that the Son of Man will come in God's glory. Some see the Transfiguration as fulfilling this prediction and a confirmation of God's "This is my beloved, my chosen..." Jesus is not only God's Son and his Chosen, but also the prophet God promised to Moses. And thus the Season ends in glory and we move into the penitential season of Lent on Ash Wednesday (March 1st).

<u>Farewell, Alleluia</u>: On the last Sunday of the Epiphany Season (February 26th) before Lent begins, the "Alleluia," the Hebrew exclamation of praise and glory to God, is "put away" during the penitential Season of Lent and is not sung again until Holy Saturday Night, the Great Vigil of Easter. The "Alleluia" sign was rolled up,

and placed in a box and 'hidden' for the Season of Lent. Sometimes the parchment was burned outside with a procession of clergy, acolytes and people, and the ashes sprinkled into the ground to symbolize a 'burial' of the "Alleluia." Then, at Easter, the Alleluia parchment was taken out with much singing as the Alleluia once again, in affirmation of the death and resurrection of Christ, was "restored" to the Eucharist. We will 'bury' the Alleluia on the Last Sunday of the Epiphany at the end of the Service after the final hymn.





Ash Wednesday: Join us on Wednesday, March 1st for the imposition of ashes at 7 PM in the sanctuary. Please note that there will be only one Ash Wednesday service this year.

Rector Search



<u>Delaware Township Food Pantry Month</u>: The food pantry has asked for the following items: sugar, oil, flour, juice, peanut butter/jelly, spaghetti sauce, rice, dried beans, canned fruit, crackers, oatmeal, cereal, household cleaners, laundry detergent, bleach, personal hygiene items. *This list includes suggestions, but any canned or nonperishable item is gratefully received.*

A letter to Holy Family from the Delware Township Trustee, Debbie Driskell:

Your congregation has faithfully donated to our pantry for many years. Words cannot express how much we appreciate your steadfast generosity. We are excited to learn that you are continuing your efforts to end hunger in our community.

The Delaware Township Food Pantry is funded solely by donations. Because of this we are able to serve two other townships besides our own. Residents of Delaware, Wayne and Fall Creek Townships may use our pantry. We feel that by serving the area that comprises our school system we better serve our community.



The Delaware Township Food Pantry distributed 27,647 pounds of food and household supplies in 2016. We aided 645 households and 2,347 people.

The number of households reflects each usage and should not be interpreted to mean 645 different households. Some families are dependent upon food pantries to supply much of their family's nutritional needs, so if they would happen to use our pantry every month they would be counted twelve times.

Usage was down this year by 1,769 pounds. We have observed that people who lost their jobs in 2016 were likely to find one more quickly than in past years. However, we are concerned that donations were also down by 2,926.5 pounds. We appreciate your help!
