

We bear witness to the Light of Christ by serving as the heart and hands of Jesus, nourishing people and transforming lives.

Worship and Feast Days

<u>Gospel Notes</u>: The Season of Lent begins with the familiar account of Jesus, before his public ministry, withdrawing to a desert to pray and fast, focusing on what lay ahead of him. In the desert there is nothing between Jesus and God: no people, no buildings, no noise, just the silence; however, in the desert silence come the forces of evil to try and tempt Jesus.

The Church's season of Lent, 40 days, is based on this time in Jesus' life where he is tempted by hunger, political power/wealth and the desire to be 'famous'. All three of the temptations (Satan is called "The Tempter") occur out in a desert because there is precisely no one around to distract Jesus.

"The Tempter" tries to entice Jesus to sin against the great commandment in Deuteronomy 6:5:

"You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, ... soul, and ... might". The "heart" was the seat of will, of moral choice; "soul" means life; "might" means possessions. The "Tempter" who represents evil forces personified, invites Jesus to prefer personal wealth and power over love of God. Jesus answers: God is the only god to be worshiped and served.



This account of Jesus alone with God and the forces of evil in the desert make the point that Jesus is the perfect lover of God, the ideal Israelite, the founder of a new way of being human.



Outreach Opportunities

<u>Homeless Month</u>: The Indiana Housing and Community Development Authority (IHCDA) has released the statewide findings from the 2015 Point-in-Time Homeless Count. Conducted every January, the count provides a snapshot of homelessness in the State of Indiana. The count did show an increase of veteran homelessness compared to 2014. For veterans with children, there were 34 persons compared to 17 last year. For veterans without children, there were 794 compared to 710 last year. Breaking down populations by category, Indiana's 2015 Point-in-Time Homeless Count observed:

- 5,863 persons comprising 4,470 households were homeless during the last week in January 2015
 - Of the persons found and identified as experiencing homelessness:



- 582 were on the streets
- 3,798 households were persons without dependent children
- 636 households were with dependent children
- 1,261 were under the age of 18 years old
- 794 of the adults counted were veterans
- 1,145 of the adults counted were persons fleeing from domestic violence
- 602 identified themselves as being characterized as "chronically homeless"
- 1,026 adults counted identified themselves as having a substance abuse disorder
- 1,099 of the adults counted identified themselves as having a serious mental illness

In 2015, an average of 1,261 homeless people in Indianapolis were under the age of 18. Please contact Deacon Cathy for ways that you can help the homeless. cscott@hfec.org
