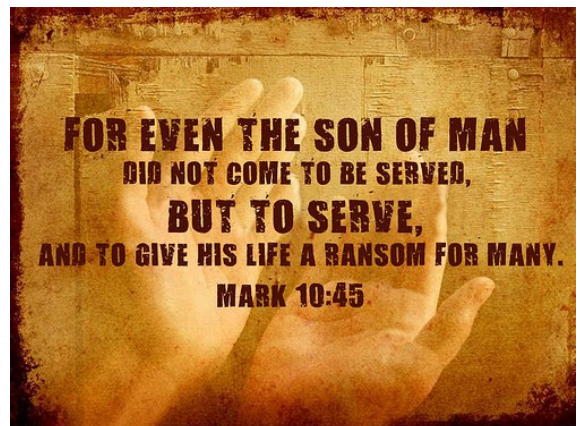

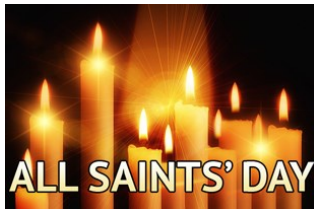

Worship and Feast Days



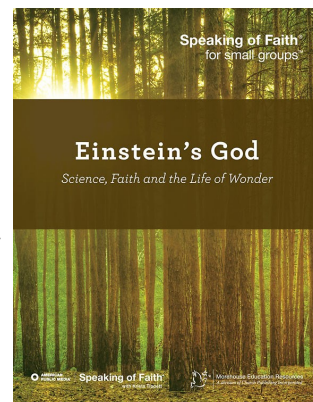

9 AM Adult Forum: Einstein's God: Science, Faith and the Life of Wonder will be presented during the next several weeks during Adult Forum. This adult formation resource was created in cooperation with the popular public radio series "On Being with Krista Tippett™" (formerly known as "Speaking of Faith® with Krista Tippett"). Explore religion's place in the hallways of science and how it impacts the mysteries of the universe that surround us all, from the unanswerable questions found in Hinduism to the beauty of complex geological systems and the universal language of mathematics. Challenge your heart and mind. Along the way on the scientific journey, gain fascinating insight into the mind of two of science's greatest thinkers, Albert Einstein and Charles Darwin.

This week: From the Scopes trial to school board controversies in our day, Charles Darwin and his theory of evolution are often portrayed as a refutation of God. Today, we'll learn about the world in which he formulated his ideas. And we'll hear his own words. Darwin, as it turns out, did not argue against God, but against a simplistic understanding of the world, its beauty and its unfolding creation.
