
Christian Education

Paul -The Man and His Mission: In Adult Forum over the next few weeks, we will be reading Paul's first letter to Timothy. We understand that Paul wrote many of the letters in the New Testament, but what do we know about him and his mission? This Sunday, September 11th, we'll discuss Paul's background, guided by the teachings of Professor Bart D. Ehrman of the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill.
