Gospel Notes from Father Steve: Last week, Jesus had an in-depth conversation with an elderly teacher and rabbi by name of Nicodemus about being "born from above" about spiritual rebirth in this extensive and fascinating meeting. In today's Gospel between Jesus and a woman of Samaria who had come to a well to draw water, a weary Jesus asks the woman for some water. The woman was a bit shocked because Jews of Jesus' time and Samaritans were bitter religious enemies: Samaritans had a different way of interpreting the Law of Moses and it led to historic hostilities between two groups who were essentially of the same



faith. Jesus' revealing and probing discussion with her connects her experience of his love for her with God's love for the world.

St. Patrick is Ireland's patron saint, known for spreading Christianity throughout the country as a missionary during the 5th century. Born somewhere in Britain arguably in the late 4th century A.D., the man who would come to be known as St. Patrick was captured by pirates as a child and brought to Ireland. During his enslavement, he was called to Christianity and escaped his captors after six years. He later returned to Ireland as a missionary, and in his teachings combined Irish pagan beliefs with Christian sacrament, devising the Celtic cross.

The Episcopal Church annually honors St. Patrick with the celebration of St. Patrick's Day on March 17th (which some cite as the date of his death), which falls during the Christian season of Lent. For more than 1,000 years, the Irish have observed St. Patrick's Day as a religious holiday. Traditionally, on St. Patrick's Day, families would attend church in the morning and embark on other rituals later—including eating a traditional meal of cabbage and Irish bacon. The holiday has notably expanded into the secular world as well, representing a robust international celebration of Irish culture and heritage.
