

Gospel Notes from Father Steve: BORN AGAIN? BORN FROM ABOVE? The Gospel for the Second Sunday of Lent this year is the famous conversation between Jesus and Nicodemus, John Chapter 3: 1-17. Nicodemus, a prominent Pharisee and teacher, comes to Jesus to ask him questions.

He comes secretly "by night," because a man of his stature could not be seen consulting Jesus. He has understood from Jesus' miracles "signs" that Jesus is "from God". But Jesus tells him that he has not yet understood the main point: to "see the kingdom of God", spiritual rebirth, being 'born from above' is required. Some bible translations had 'born again' which has led to all kinds of misunderstandings among Christians especially as regards, in later centuries, the baptism of children.



Nicodemus misunderstands: he thinks that Jesus is speaking of biological rebirth saying, "how can I possibly go back into my mother's womb??' The conversation between Jesus and this learned Jewish teacher is one of the most intriguing in the Gospel encounters Jesus had with the religious teachers of his day.

Taizé presents the gifts of meditation, music, and prayers in shared community as well as silence and serenity that evokes the mystery of the Sacred in our midst.
