No One Dies Alone (NODA): On Saturday, January 20th at 10 AM, the Eskenazi Health No One Dies Alone (NODA) program will offer an orientation session for people interested in learning more about becoming a volunteer for the program. Eskenazi Health employees are encouraged to invite friends and family members to learn more about this wonderful volunteer experience. The session will be held at Eskenazi Hospital, 720 Eskenazi Ave. Interested participants should email noda@eskenazihealth.edu or call 317.880.8263. The program uses volunteer companions who are notified when patients are alone and expected to die in the next 24 to 72 hours. The companions come to the hospital and stay with the patients, rotating through three-hour shifts, to ensure they are not left alone in their final moments. During the vigil, the volunteer companions talk to the patients, hold their hand or just serve as a compassionate presence in the room.
