Ash Wednesday: Ash Wednesday services will be held at 8 AM and 7 PM on Wednesday, February 14th in the sanctuary.







Outreach Opportunities

<u>February Outreach - Delaware Township Trustee</u>: Donations of non-perishable and personal hygiene items are gratefully accepted by the Delaware Township Trustee's office food pantry. Items can be placed in the gray baskets in the narthex near the coat racks. Here's a message from the township:

Thanks so much for Holy Family's support for the township food pantry. Holy Family has been a faithful partner for many years, and we appreciate your generosity. In 2016 our pantry distributed




If a Delaware Township household applies for Township Assistance we are able to supply a purchase order for food, as trustees endeavor to meet applicants basic needs of shelter, utilities and food. We then suggest that they apply for foodstamps or SNAP benefits if it seems likely that they are eligible. The application for Township Assistance is a much more arduous process than a visit to the food pantry which we try to keep as simple and unobtrusive as is reasonable. We do try to watch and make sure that people are using the pantry appropriately. Generally this is not a problem, but when it is we handle it quickly and effectively. Most of the households who use the pantry are working or are retired on Social Security. They just need a little help to get through the month and most people seems to be very grateful. <u>Flip Your Lid</u>: Girl Scout Troop 183 is raising money to buy a Buddy Bench for Hoosier Road Elementary by collecting caps and lids to recycle with GREEN TREE PLASTICS, LLC. It takes 400 lbs. of caps for the bench, and that's about 10, 55-gallon trash bags full! A complete list of accepted caps and lids is posted on the collection bin in the Narthex.
