Outreach Opportunities

February Outreach - Delaware Township Trustee: Donations of non-perishable and personal hygiene items are gratefully accepted by the Delaware Township Trustee's office food pantry. Items can be placed in the gray baskets in the narthex near the coat racks.

Thanks so much for Holy Family's support for the township food pantry. Holy Family has been a faithful partner for many years, and we appreciate your generosity. In 2016 our pantry distributed 27,708.5 lbs, of food and household supplies to 646 households. That does not mean 646 differ-

ent households, as a household is counted with each usage. In 2017 our numbers were up. We issued 30,976 lbs. to 768 families. As you can see, your donations are important. The Delaware Township Pantry serves Delaware, Wayne and Fall Creek Townships. These three townships comprise our school system. We are prohibited from using tax dollars to stock the pantry so we rely entirely upon donations.

> Flip Your Lid: Girl Scout Troop 183 is raising money to buy a Buddy Bench for Hoosier Road Elementary by collecting caps and lids to recycle with GREEN TREE PLASTICS, LLC. It takes 400 lbs. of caps for the bench, and that's about ten 55-gallon trash bags full! A complete list of accepted caps and lids is posted on the collection bin in the Narthex.

Mission Opportunity: Mentoring Former Hamilton County Jail Inmates. WorkOne, Indiana's employment service, will host an informational meeting for volunteers interested in serving as mentors to former Hamilton County Jail inmates who have completed an employment/career development program designed to connect them to long-term employment. The program dovetails well with the current jail/

prison ministry in which several members of Holy Family participate.
