The Holy Gospel

Matthew 21:1-11

When they had come near Jerusalem and had reached Bethphage, at the Mount of Olives, Jesus sent two disciples, saying to them, "Go into the village ahead of you, and immediately you will find a donkey tied, and a colt with her; untie them and bring them to

me. If anyone says anything to you, just say this, 'The Lord needs them.' And he will send them immediately." This took place to fulfill what had been spoken through the prophet, saying, "Tell the daughter of Zion, Look, your king is coming to you, humble, and mounted on a donkey, and on a colt, the foal of a donkey." The disciples went and did as Jesus had directed them; they brought the donkey and the colt, and put their cloaks on them, and he sat on them. A very large crowd spread their cloaks on the road, and others cut branches from the trees and spread them on the road. The crowds that went ahead of him and that followed were shouting, "Hosanna to the Son of David! Blessed is the one who comes in the name of the Lord! Hosanna in the highest heaven!" When he entered Jerusalem, the whole city was in turmoil, asking, "Who is this?" The crowds were saying, "This is the prophet Jesus from Nazareth in Galilee."

Maundy Thursday, April 9, 7 PM Facebook Watch Party: The Last Supper is remembered with Scripture readings about the first Eucharist and Jesus washing the disciples' feet to teach them about the call to servant ministry for all Christians. The Rev. Cathy Scott will offer the sermon.

Good Friday, April 10, 7 PM Facebook Watch Party: This solemn service commemorates Christ's suffering and death on the cross by offering readings, special prayers, and a sermon by The Rev. Cathy Gray.

Easter Vigil, April 11, 7 PM Facebook Watch Party: This Saturday evening worship is the first service of Easter. This service features the reading of Scripture that illuminates "God's saving deeds in history" and the proclamation that "Christ is risen". The Rev. Bruce Gray will offer the sermon.

Easter Day April 12, 9:00 AM Facebook Watch Party: The Easter morning service will feature special music as well as the prayers and readings for Easter. The Rev. Bruce Gray will offer the sermon.
