The Second Reading *1 Thessalonians 1:1-10*

Paul, Silvanus, and Timothy, To the church of the Thessalonians in God the Father and the Lord Jesus Christ:

Grace to you and peace.

We always give thanks to God for all of you and mention you in our prayers, constantly remembering before our God and Father your work of faith and labor of love and steadfastness of hope in our Lord Jesus Christ. For we know, brothers and sisters beloved by God, that he has chosen you, because our message of the gospel came to you not in word only, but also in power and in the Holy Spirit and with full conviction; just as you know what kind of persons we proved to be among you for your sake. And you became imitators of us and of the Lord, for in spite of persecution you received the word with joy inspired by the Holy Spirit, so that you became an example to all the believers in Macedonia and in Achaia. Worship Together at Holy Family: During the Sunday worship services at 8 and 10 AM, the Holy Eucharist (communion) will be offered at Holy Family, using the parking lot. People will be asked to stay in or near their cars or scatter on the grass (camping chairs are welcome), wear masks, and keep at least six feet away from other households. Following the bishop's guidelines, the Holy Eucharist will be shared only in the form of wafers and will be brought to each car or lawn group by the clergy. The 9 AM online service will continue to be offered weekly, and hopefully the COVID-19 conditions will allow for the 8 and 10 Holy Eucharist worship services to also be held weekly. Always check the parish website, email messages, and social media to confirm that in-person worship is taking place on any given Sunday. By worshipping outside, we are able to continue to say that All Are Welcome! Many volunteers will be needed, so please sign up using [Sign Up Genius](#) if you can help with any of the roles for Sunday. For more information, contact Fr.
