The Nicene Creed

Return to In-Person Worship: Palm Sunday:

In-person worship in the church is scheduled to resume March 28th, Palm Sunday, with services at 8 and 10 AM• If there is a large uptick in the statistics this decision will be revisited, so please keep an eye on email and website announcements. Wearing masks, social distancing, and other safety requirements will be followed. To help with physically spreading people out, the service will be shown live in the parish hall.
