The word of the Lord came to Abram in a vision, "Do not be afraid, Abram, I am your shield; your reward shall be very great." Holy Family Regathering Plan: The Regathering Committee met on Tuesday, February 8th, to discuss current COVID-19 policies and procedures in light of Bishop Jennifer's visit and changing statistics in the county and state. The Committee bases its decisions on CDC recommendations, Diocesan requirements, and parishioner input. Moving forward, some changes are able to be made to reinstate some practices and traditions that the #holyvillage members hold dear. The Committee is very excited that moving forward is now possible and would like to emphasize the need for volunteers and parishioner leadership to implement the proposed changes. After having to say "no" for two long years, it is a joy to say "yes!" to the challenges of this pandemic. The Regathering Committee encourages all parishioners to discover how to fit into the "new normal" and asks for patience, grace, and understanding as the church navigates these new and exciting opportunities.

Based on CDC guidelines, Holy Family no longer requires masks for everyone during worship and other indoor events, except for those under age 2. Fortunately fully-vaccinated people are at a very low risk of serious COVID illnesses, but Holy Family wants to be considerate of people who cannot be vaccinated due to age or medical conditions. In keeping with CDC guidelines, if anyone in your household tests positive for COVID, the household should isolate for 5 days beginning the day of positive testing. This is a new guideline as the original guideline was 10 days from positive testing. All family members should mask outside the house for this additional 5 days. Feel free to contact Fr.
