## The Holy Gospel

*Luke 15:1-3, 11b-32*

All the tax collectors and sinners were coming near to listen to Jesus. And the Pharisees and the scribes were grumbling and saying, "This fellow welcomes sinners and eats with them." So Jesus told them this parable: "There was a man who had two sons. The younger of them said to his father, 'Father, give me the share of the property that will belong to me.' So he divided his property between them. A few days later the younger son gathered all he had and traveled to a distant country, and there he squandered his property in dissolute living. When he had spent everything, a severe famine took place throughout that country, and he began to be in need. So he went and hired himself out to one of the citizens of that country, who sent him to his fields to feed the pigs. He would gladly have filled himself with the pods that the pigs were eating; and no one gave him anything. But when he came to himself he said, 'How many of my father's hired hands have bread enough and to spare, but here I am dying of hunger! I will get up and go to my father, and I will say to him, "Father, I have sinned against heaven and before you; I am no longer worthy to be called your son; treat me like one of your hired hands."' So he set off and went to his father. But while he was still far off, his father saw him and was filled with compassion; he ran and put his arms around him and kissed him. Then the son said to him, 'Father, I have sinned against heaven and before you; I am no longer worthy to be called your son.' But the father said to his slaves, 'Quickly, bring out a robe--the best one--and put it on him; put a ring on his finger and sandals on his feet. And get the fatted calf and kill it, and let us eat and celebrate; for this son of mine was dead and is alive again; he was lost and is found!' And they began to celebrate. "Now his elder son was in the field; and when he came and approached the house, he heard music and dancing. He called one of the slaves and asked what was going on. He replied, 'Your brother has come, and your father has killed the fatted calf, because he has got him back safe and sound.' Then he became angry and refused to go in. His father came out and began to plead with him. But

he answered his father, 'Listen! For all these years I have been working like a slave for you, and I have never disobeyed your command; yet you have never given me even a young goat so that I might celebrate with my friends. But when this son of yours came back, who has devoured your property with prostitutes, you killed the fatted calf for him!' Then the father said to him, 'Son, you are always with me, and all that is mine is yours. But we had to celebrate and rejoice, because this brother of yours was dead and has come to life; he was lost and has been found.'

Holy and gracious Father: In your infinite love you made us for yourself, and, when we had fallen into sin and become subject to evil and death, you, in your mercy, sent Jesus Christ, your only and eternal Son, to share our human nature, to live and die as one of us, to reconcile us to you, the God and Father of all. Holy Family Regathering Plan: The Regathering Committee met on Tuesday, February 8th, to discuss current COVID-19 policies and procedures in light of Bishop Jennifer's visit and changing statistics in the county and state. The Committee bases its decisions on CDC recommendations, Diocesan requirements, and parishioner input. Moving forward, some changes are able to be made to reinstate some practices and traditions that the #holylvillage members hold dear. The Committee is very excited that moving forward is now possible and would like to emphasize the need for volunteers and parishioner leadership to implement the proposed changes. After having to say "no" for two long years, it is a joy to say "yes!" to the challenges of this pandemic. The Regathering Committee encourages all parishioners to discover how to fit into the "new normal" and asks for patience, grace, and understanding as the church navigates these new and exciting opportunities.

Based on CDC guidelines, Holy Family no longer requires masks for everyone during worship and other indoor events, except for those under age 2. Fortunately fully-vaccinated people are at a very low risk of serious COVID illnesses, but Holy Family wants to be considerate of people who cannot be vaccinated due to age or medical conditions. In keeping with CDC guidelines, if anyone in your household tests positive for COVID, the household should isolate for 5 days beginning the day of positive testing. This is a new guideline as the original guideline was 10 days from positive testing. All family members should mask outside the house for this additional 5 days. Feel free to contact Fr.
