Support for Kairos Ministry: Holy Family members Stephen Canter, Scott Wilson, and Andy Wilson will be spending time with inmates at the Pendleton Correctional Facility leading the Kairos program on April 25-28, 2024. This program focuses on sharing God's love, listening to the inmates, building up their spirits with love, helping them build and maintain a Christian ministry inside the walls, then successfully reenter the "outside world" after serving their sentences. Here are some ways that you can support this ministry:
