Luke 2:22-40

Priest The Holy Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ
according to Luke.

When the time came for their purification according to the law of Moses, the parents of Jesus brought him up to Jerusalem to present him to the Lord (as it is written in the law of the Lord, "Every firstborn male shall be designated as holy to the Lord"), and they offered a sacrifice according to what is stated in the law of the Lord, "a pair of turtledoves or two young pigeons." Now there was a man in Jerusalem whose name was Simeon; this man was righteous and devout, looking forward to the consolation of Israel, and the Holy Spirit rested on him. It had been revealed to him by the Holy Spirit that he would not see death before he had seen the Lord's Messiah. Guided by the Spirit, Simeon came into the temple; and when the parents brought in the child Jesus, to do for him what was customary under the law, Simeon took him in his arms and praised God, saying, "Master, now you are dismissing your servant in peace, according to your word; for my eyes have seen your salvation, which you have prepared in the presence of all peoples, a light for revelation to the Gentiles and for glory to your people Israel." And the child's father and mother were amazed at what was being said about him. Then Simeon blessed them and said to his mother Mary, "This child is destined for the falling and the rising of many in Israel, and to be a sign that will be opposed so that the inner thoughts of many will be revealed-- and a sword will pierce your own soul too." There was also a prophet, Anna the daughter of Phanuel, of the tribe of Asher. She was of a great age, having lived with her husband seven years after her marriage, then as a widow to the age of eighty-four. She never left the temple but worshiped there with fasting and prayer night and day. At that moment she came, and began to praise God and to speak about the child to all who were looking for the redemption of Jerusalem. When they had finished everything required by the law of the Lord, they returned to Galilee, to their own town of Nazareth. The child grew and became strong, filled with wisdom; and the favor of God was upon him.

The Ending of a Pastoral Relationship

The Rector addresses the Bishop's Deputy and the congregation with these words

On the Fifth day of May 2018, I was inducted by Bishop Jennifer Baskerville Burrows as rector of Holy Family Episcopal Church Fishers Indiana. I have, with God's help and to the best of my abilities, exercised this trust, accepting its privileges and responsibilities.

After prayer and careful consideration, it now seems to me that I should leave this charge, and I publicly state that my tenure as rector of ends this day.

The Bishop's Deputy says

Do you, the people of Holy Family, recognize and accept the conclusion of this pastoral relationship?

People We do.

The Rector presents to the wardens the keys of the parish.

The Bishop's Deputy may then indicate what provision has been made for the continuation of the ministries of the

parish. She may declare the name of the persons to have ecclesiastical responsibility, and may request, if it seems appropriate, other leaders in the parish to continue their leadership until a new incumbent is installed. She may express her feelings about the ministry now coming to its end.

The departing Rector and the congregation then say together the following prayer

O God, you have bound us together for a time as pastor and people to work for the advancement of your kingdom in this place: We give you humble and hearty thanks for the ministry which we have shared in these years now past.

Especially we thank you for your never-failing presence with us through these years, and for the deeper knowledge of you and of each other which we have attained.

We thank you for those who have been joined to this part of Christ's family through baptism. We thank you for opening our hearts and minds again and again to your Word, and for feeding us abundantly with the Sacrament of the Body and Blood of your Son.

Now, we pray, be with those who leave and with us who stay; and grant that all of us, by drawing ever nearer to you, may always be close to each other in the communion of your saints. All this we ask for the sake of Jesus Christ, your Son, our Lord. Amen.

Exciting Announcement from Holy Family Vestry: As you know, the Vestry has been in discussions with the Transition Minister for the Diocese regarding plans for Holy Family after Father Bruce retires. There are several search models the Vestry could have pursued, and we discussed the merits of each one. While the next step would have involved the creation of a Discernment Committee to select the next Rector, the Vestry was instead presented with a unique and exciting opportunity.

The Diocese had found a candidate who meets Holy Family's needs and brought this candidate for our consideration. The Vestry met with the candidate and unanimously agreed with enthusiasm that this would be a wonderful fit for Holy Family. The Vestry, therefore, proceeded to call them as our new Priest-in-Charge. A Priest-in-Charge has an initial three-year contract with the church, after which the priest and the congregation decide whether they want to make the relationship permanent.

We are pleased to share that all the pieces have fallen into place. While Fr. Bruce is leaving big shoes to fill, we believe we have found the right fit for Holy Family in Fr. Frank Impicicche

from St. Matthew's Episcopal Church in Indianapolis. Fr. Frank's first Sunday will be March 2nd, which is the last Sunday of the Epiphany. We will have supply clergy in place for the weeks between Fr. Bruce's retirement and Fr. Frank's arrival. In addition to keeping Fr. Bruce and Cathy in your prayers, please remember Fr. Frank and St. Matthew's during this transition.

We hope you are as excited as we are and look forward to the next chapter in our church life. Please reach out to any of us on the vestry if you have questions or concerns.
