Adult Forum

Adult Forum meets on Sundays from 9:00 to 9:50 AM to study books of the Bible, thematic studies based on Scripture, or other texts designed to expand the understanding of Christian belief. Occasionally

there are other study groups to discuss current events and topics presented by Father Frank and members of the congregation.



Prayer Group

Prayer group meets monthly to pray over requests submitted by the members of



the congregation, for those in need of healing, and for issues that are a cause for concern in the community, the nation, and the world.

Music & Meditation

This group gathers to enjoy music played on records that follow a monthly theme. Some



topics have included a focus on women artists, guided meditation, and light & love.







Holy Family supports a variety of community partners with seasonal collections such as Thanksgiving baskets, Angel Tree, and supplies for the Humane Society of Hamilton County.

Hospitality

Preparing and providing the refreshments for the coffee hours that follow Sunday services is a simple ministry that is deeply appreciated. Extra help is always needed for special events like Easter Brunch.





Support a Teacher/Staff (SATS)

What started during Covid as a classroom snack/mask drive for teachers, through the generous support of Holy Family parishioners organized into teams, now serves 75 plus



teachers and staff of Fishers Elementary with monthly gifts such as chocolate, inspirational notes, and a picnic.

Sunday 10 AM Childcare

Babies, toddlers, and children in PreK-1st grade are well caredfor in playtime during the first thirty minutes of the 10 AM worship service so that parents can easily participate without distraction.





Healing Ministers

These members of the congregation are available during Sunday services at the side altar, during communion, to pray with those in need of spiritual healing and prayer.





Readers and Intercessors

Also known as lectors, readers recite the lessons (scripture) appointed for each worship service and lead the congregation in the prayers of the people.


Media Ministry

Spreading the "good news" within the congregation and to the larger community through current technology is the responsibility of this ministry, especially producing the livestream of most services. These volunteers also manage the microphones and other AV devices used during worship.



Ushers and Greeters

Holy Family's ushers and greeters give members of the congregation and visitors a warm welcome and any assistance they need



during worship services. They direct the flow of movement at communion and pass the collection plate. They also direct people to the restrooms, childcare, parish hall, and other spaces as needed.

Music Ministry

Musicians play the piano and organ to accompany the choir during the Offertory anthem and the congregation during hymns. There are always opportunities for special music on other instruments as solos or as additions to choir anthems.



Choir

Holy Family's choir enriches the 10 o'clock service and special worship services throughout the year. Rehearsals are at 7-8 PM on Thursday evenings. New voices are always welcome.







Chalice Bearers

Chalice bearers serve the communion wine during worship services.

Acolytes

Youth and adults participate in this ministry by carrying the cross and candles during worship and serving the priest during the set up for communion. They are also essential

during special services such as baptisms and weddings.





Altar Guild

This important ministry prepares the sanctuary for worship and assists with clean-up afterwards. Responsibilities include maintaining altar linens, communion vessels, and candles. It's a great way to learn about the rich history of Episcopal worship.

Bread Bakers

During Communion, Holy Family offers homemade bread that is lovingly baked by volunteers in their homes.







Book Club

Reading The World book club meets monthly to discuss novels that

expand participants' horizons. For the convenience of participants, this group meets online. Some books have a connection to spirituality, and others have a more worldly focus.



Game Night

Game Night folks gather on the first Friday of each month to play a variety of card and board games. Sometimes there are special themes such as space, chess, and focus groups such as children, teens, or 50+.

Dinner Groups

Dinner Groups are comprised of 2-4 households from the



congregation. Based on when it works best for their schedules, they gather regularly in homes, at restaurants, or in the parish hall to share a meal and fellowship. It's a great way to meet new people and make connections.

Meal Ministry

Holy Family supports members of the parish by providing home-cooked meals or restaurant gift cards in times of need such as following surgery, in time of illness, or when welcoming a baby to the family.

and property entrusted to the parish. There are often specific projects during the year for individuals or teams to tackle.



Children's Ministry

Christian education for children is essential at Holy Family. Volunteers deliver


lessons prepared by the Children's Ministry Director. Students participate in a variety of

Youth Group

Youth Group creates a space which encourages youth to cultivate personal relationships with God and each other.



Sunday School centers around the lectionary readings and emphasizes critical thinking while in a safe and accepting environment. Other gatherings are more relaxed and include games, music, outreach, and small group discussion.

Daughters of the King

These women gather together to share in prayer, fellowship, and collective ministering to others in need including preparing meals and sending care packages to students in college, as well as hosting retreats for all women of the church.

Men's Ministry

This group of men gathers to study scripture, serve others, and enjoy fellowship. They meet monthly and assist with many activities in the church including preparing food at cookouts and
