A Reading from the Book of Acts

11:1-18

Now the apostles and the believers who were in Judea heard that the Gentiles had also accepted the word of God. So when Peter went up to Jerusalem, the circumcised believers criticized him, saying, "Why did you go to uncircumcised men and eat with them?" Then Peter began to explain it to them, step by step, saying, "I was in the city of Joppa praying, and in a trance I saw a vision. There was

something like a large sheet coming down from heaven, being lowered by its four corners; and it came close to me. As I looked at it closely I saw four-footed animals, beasts of prey, reptiles, and birds of the air. I also heard a voice saying to me, 'Get up, Peter; kill and eat.' But I replied, 'By no means, Lord; for nothing profane or unclean has ever entered my mouth.' But a second time the voice answered from heaven, 'What God has made clean, you must not call profane.' This happened three times; then everything was pulled up again to heaven. At that very moment three men, sent to me from Caesarea, arrived at the house where we were. The Spirit told me to go with them and not to make a distinction between them and us. These six brothers also accompanied me, and we entered the man's house. He told us how he had seen the angel standing in his house and saying, 'Send to Joppa and bring Simon, who is called Peter; he will give you a message by which you and your entire household will be saved.' And as I began to speak, the Holy Spirit fell upon them just as it had upon us at the beginning. And I remembered the word of the Lord, how he had said, 'John baptized with water, but you will be baptized with the Holy Spirit.' If then God gave them the same gift that he gave us when we believed in the Lord Jesus Christ, who was I that I could hinder God?" When they heard this, they were silenced. And they praised God, saying, "Then God has given even to the Gentiles the repentance that leads to life."

Please Ask Before You Act!: There is a myth in parish administration that things slow down after the "program year" ends and that the summer months are filled with rest, reflection, and renewal. While the busy liturgical seasons may be behind us for this year, the Season of Planning and Preparation is on our doorstep! As we settle into a less hectic liturgical calendar, the Staff, Vestry, and I are busy working on various projects and processes. We are revising and revamping many of our policies and procedures and ways of doing things in the hopes of ensuring greater consistency and clarity in the way we are organized at Holy Family. For example, we are in the process of developing a different approach to how we care for our building and grounds. We are still in the early stages of this process but hope to slowly put new procedures into place. Other examples include organizing for receptions or special events at the parish. The people at Holy Family have always been good about seeing something that needs to be done and then jumping in to do it. While this has been greatly appreciated over the years, as we go forward, we are asking you to "Ask Before you Act." We need space to implement new ideas and also want to avoid possible miscommunication or
