KF: "I do have the gift of prophecy....much to my family's dismay! Everyone loves the person with the gift of prophecy who uses it to encourage and to shed light on a situation, the person who acts as a cheerleader ...but when it comes to being an instrument for God convicting others of the need to repent and change their ways---like John the Baptist--- or to rise up higher in their walk with Him, both the messenger and the message can be less enthusiastically received!"

LP: "In all honesty, I suppose it's the gift that feels most uncomfortable to talk about because it seems so...well, bossy. In the mix of gifts that God has given me, Prophecy seems to work in partnership with Teaching and Discernment. The mix of prophecy and discernment shows up in how I view the communities I'm involved in. Often I'll see needs or gaps in how that community is functioning--for example, in my family, I'm generally the one who identifies areas where we can work together more effectively or improve how we relate to each other. In my work, I sometimes see future directions in education that would help our program. The teaching gift then kicks in and prompts me to suggest courses of action. In a healthy community, I think Prophecy should be weighed against the wisdom of Scripture and/or the broader communal wisdom so that the ideas/practices that come from it are confirmed."

JK: "With some people, I have a knack for 'speaking forth' and helping them decipher God's intents and purposes in their life...even if they resist (which is how people often respond to prophets!). I have some reluctance in embracing the 'prophet' label because of the misconception of predicting the future, but I have recognized that God has given me unique access and connections to so many people who seem willing to open up to me, which then enables me to 'speak forth' key aspects of God's will in their lives."
