A Reading from the Prophet Jeremiah

Presider The Holy Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ

In the time of King Herod, after Jesus was born in Bethlehem of Judea, wise men from the East came to Jerusalem, asking, "Where is the child who has been born king of the Jews? For we observed his star at its rising, and have come to pay him homage." When King Herod heard this, he was frightened, and all Jerusalem with him; and calling together all the chief priests and scribes of the people, he inquired of them where the Messiah was to be born. They told him, "In Bethlehem of Judea; for so it has been written by the prophet: 'And you, Bethlehem, in the land of Judah, are by no means least among the rulers of Judah; for from you shall come a ruler who is to shepherd my people Israel.'"

Then Herod secretly called for the wise men and learned from them the exact time when the star had appeared. Then he sent them to Bethlehem, saying, "Go and search diligently for the child; and when you have found him, bring me word so that I may also go and pay him homage." When they had heard the king, they set out; and there, ahead of them, went the star that they had seen at its rising, until it stopped over the place where the child was. When they saw that the star had stopped, they were overwhelmed with joy. On entering the house, they saw the child with Mary his mother; and they knelt down and paid him homage. Then,

opening their treasure chests, they offered him gifts of gold, frankincense, and myrrh. And having been warned in a dream not to return to Herod, they left for their own country by another road.

We pray for unity and acceptance, rejoicing in the changing diversity of our community. We pray for social connection for newcomers within our growing church. We pray that leaders and citizens reflect, identify, and address the needs of the unseen, and/or underserved. We pray for our continued support of Delaware Township Trustee's Food Bank, Fishers Elementary School, and to continue to expand outreach initiatives. We pray that we are aware and responsive to environmental concerns and be good stewards of our natural resources. **In your love, answer us.**

We pray for our parish — for its members, ministries, leaders, and all who find belonging, hope, and spiritual nourishment within this church family. Lord, we thank you for our community here at Holy Family and all of the ministries, seen and unseen, that come together to do your work. We ask your blessing and guidance for all of those who contribute to the ministry and outreach of our church family, including the acolytes, prison ministry volunteers, children's ministry, youth ministry, bread makers, AV experts, administrative staff, ushers, Saint Francis ministers,

musicians, and all others whose work may go unnoticed, but not unappreciated. **In your love, answer us.**

We pray for those in our parish cycle of prayer – the Gray, Guenin, and Hamon families, and those who serve as Vestry members. For in these last days you sent him to be incarnate from the Virgin Mary, to be the Savior and Redeemer of the world. In him, you have delivered us from evil, and made us worthy to stand before you. In him, you have brought us out of error into truth, out of sin into righteousness, out of death into life. He stretched out his arms upon the cross, and offered himself, in obedience to your will, a perfect sacrifice for the whole world.

On the night before he died for us, our Lord Jesus Christ took bread; and when he had given thanks to you, he broke it,

and gave it to his disciples, and said, "Take, eat: This is my Body, which is given for you. Do this for the remembrance of me."
