3/31 Stations of the Cross: During Holy Week, we will gather for the Stations of the Cross on Tuesday, March 31st at 7 PM. All are invited to come and walk this sacred path together. The Stations of the Cross is a devotional practice that invites us to follow Jesus on the way of his suffering and death. Moving from station to station, we recall key moments – from his condemnation to his crucifixion and burial – through scripture, prayer, and silence. In the Episcopal tradition, the Stations are not only a remembrance of past events, but an opportunity to enter more deeply into Christ’s love, to reflect on the suffering present in our world, and to bring our own prayers to the cross. This quiet, reflective liturgy offers space to slow down, to be present with Christ, and to prepare our hearts for the hope of Easter. We hope you will join us. - Father Frank
